From the Pulpit - Not Just a Sunday, it is a Season

Easter (was March 31st this year) is one of the principal holidays, or feasts, of Christianity. It marks the Resurrection of Jesus three days after his death by crucifixion. For many Christian churches, Easter is the joyful end of the Lenten season of fasting and penitence. The earliest recorded observance of an Easter celebration comes from the 2nd century, though the commemoration of Jesus' Resurrection probably occurred earlier. At WBPC, our joyful service with the flowering cross, wonderful music and sharing of the word is our traditional Easter Sunday.

Celebrating the resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday is a wonderful, highpoint of our Christian year. Without the resurrection there would be no Christian faith. But Easter is not just a Sunday, it is a season. The Easter season is the second-longest liturgical season. Only ordinary time is longer. The Church celebrates the Easter season (also known as "Eastertide") for 50 days, culminating with the feast of Pentecost, where Scripture (Acts 2:1–31) tells us that the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles. This year Eastertide starts March 31 (Easter Sunday), continues with seven Sundays of Easter, and then ends on May 18th (Day of Pentecost). Although not a Sunday, within this time period we also recognize the Ascension of the Lord on May 9.

Our PC(USA) Mission Agency tells us "The season of Easter is intended to be a joyful time for celebrating the presence of the risen Christ in the church. Of course, Easter really isn't just a season either. In the fullest sense, Easter is a new way of life — in which we are "dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:11), called to "walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:4). Every year, for fifty days, the church celebrates and rehearses this new way of life in the Season of Easter — as we await its completion in the fullness of Christ's reign."

Let us celebrate the full season of Easter


Upcoming Adult Ed – Why? By Adam Hamilton

A new Adult Education series will start on Monday evening April 8 at 7 PM. We will be using a curriculum entitled "Why? Making Sense of God's Will" by Adam Hamilton. The book and connected videos will cover four weeks with the provocative titles:

Why Do the Innocent Suffer? Why Do My prayers Go Unanswered? Why Can't I See god's Will for My Life? Why God's Love Prevails.

The author's introduction says "As I counsel with parishioners, talk with those curious about faith or struggling with faith, and have conversations with complete strangers, I can count on the question of theodicy to come up with great regularity: If there is a loving and all-powerful God, why do bad things happen? My aim in writing WHY? Was to distill into a very short book a way of thinking about this question that I've found helpful in making sense not only of suffering but also of intercessory prayer and of what is meant when Scripture speaks of God's will. I wanted the book to be brief enough to be read in one sitting, and in a format that readers might easily share with a friend."
