## From the Pulpit...

### Being a Missional Church

One of the messages of current church planning literature is that our churches need to be more missional, more outward focused. Sarah Cunningham in her book Portable Faith – How to Take Your Church to the Community shares the following incident that demonstrates the dilemma.

“The church?” The middle-aged woman behind the desk at the local bond office asked incredulously, tucking a stray strand of silvering-brown hair behind her ear. “I don’t see how ‘the church’ would change anything about a community. There have been churches here since before the city was chartered.”

The woman, although saying things that felt inflammatory to my seasoned religious ears, was difficult to dislike given her gentle-flowing tone and the weathered, mom-of-many smile lines that framed her eyes. I could image her bustling about a kitchen in a flour-covered apron, basting a turkey and offering me a tall glass of milk on Thanksgiving.

“There are at least a dozen churches within a four-block radius of here and that doesn’t change anything.” She gestured at the surrounding area almost sympathetically. “The city is the same as it’s always been. Same problems, same hardship, same cycles. Churches hold weekly services for anyone who wants to come, but I don’t think there’s any reason to believe they impact people beyond their own buildings.”

As we continue our efforts through the New Beginnings Act 2 activities to set direction for the future of West Berlin Presbyterian Church, it will behoove us to look carefully at our role in being missional in our community. We can both be of service to our community while seeking to follow the great commandment of making disciples of all nations.

With Holy Week rapidly coming up on us, it is a great time to once again, or maybe for the first time, invite friends, neighbors, relatives to join us for Palm Sunday (April 9, 10:30 AM, 11:30 AM Easter egg hunt for children); Maundy Thursday (April 13, 7:00 PM w communion, and Easter Sunday (April 16, 9:45 AM for hot cross buns, 10:30 AM worship).

### Maundy Thursday Service & Communion April 13, 2017 - 7:00 PM

Please join us on Thursday, April 13, 2017 for the Maundy Thursday Service.

Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper when Jesus shared the Passover meal with his disciples on the night before he was crucified. While different denominations observe Maundy Thursday in their own distinct ways, two important biblical events are the primary focus of Maundy Thursday solemnizations:

Before the Passover meal, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples.

By performing this lowly act of service, the Bible says in John 13:1 that Jesus "showed them the full extent of his love." By his example, Jesus demonstrated how Christians are to love one another through humble service.

During the Passover meal, Jesus took bread and wine and asked his Father to bless it. He broke the bread into pieces, giving it to his disciples and said, "This is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Then he took the cup of wine, shared it with his disciples and said, "This wine is the token of God's new covenant to save you--an agreement sealed with the blood I will pour out for you."

These events recorded in Luke 22:19-20 describe the Last Supper and form the biblical basis for the practice of Communion. For this reason, many churches hold special Communion services as a part of their Maundy Thursday celebrations and include West Berlin Presbyterian Church.

The word "Maundy" is derived from the Latin word *mandatum*, meaning "commandment," *Maundy* refers to the commands Jesus gave his disciples at the Last Supper: to love with humility by serving one another and to remember his sacrifice. Hope you will join us for this special service.
