From the Pulpit...

I am very pleased with the support and interest the whole congregation has been taking in our continued New Beginnings activities and planning. One of my jobs in this process has been to look around to see what others are saying that could be helpful. I recently came across an article by entitled **3 Starter Principles for Becoming an Innovative Small Church (**Karl Vaters, *Copyright* © 2015 by the *author or Christianity Today/Leadership Journal.*) I would like to share his three principles for your consideration as we consider our church's action plan.

1. Connect the Congregation to the Church's Innovative Heritage

No one starts a church because they have a set of hymns they plan to sing forever; or because they want to maintain a building; or because they expect the preacher to do all the work. Churches are started by visionary people who want God to do something in and through their lives and their community. One way to get excited about the next wave of visionary thinking is to tie the new ideas back to the original church visionaries – some of whom might be our own ancestors.

2. Strip Away Everything but Jesus

We get together every week to hear teaching from the bible, a book whose newest sections are almost 2,000 years old, and then we can't understand what makes for resistant to change. Really? We need to tie today's changes back to that amazing, life-giving, truer-than-ever 2,000-year-old book. But remember, Jesus Christ was the most revolutionary, innovative, world-changing person who ever lived. His followers should be the same.

3. Make it a Conversation

There's an old saying that you need to earn the right to be heard. That used to be true. Not anymore. Years of manipulative advertising have made people very savvy to social cues. We can tell when someone's listening with genuine interest. And we can tell when they're just keeping quiet until it's their turn to talk. We have to do more than earn the right to be heard. We have to *actually listen* to what people are saying. Monolog has to be replaced with dialog. Dialog doesn't earn you the right to make your point – dialog *is* the point.

Finally, Vater closes with the idea that we need to realize that, while some resistance to change may come from people's fears, some resistance may actually be the voice of experience and wisdom. You can't know which is which until you know the person better. And you can't know the person without listening.
